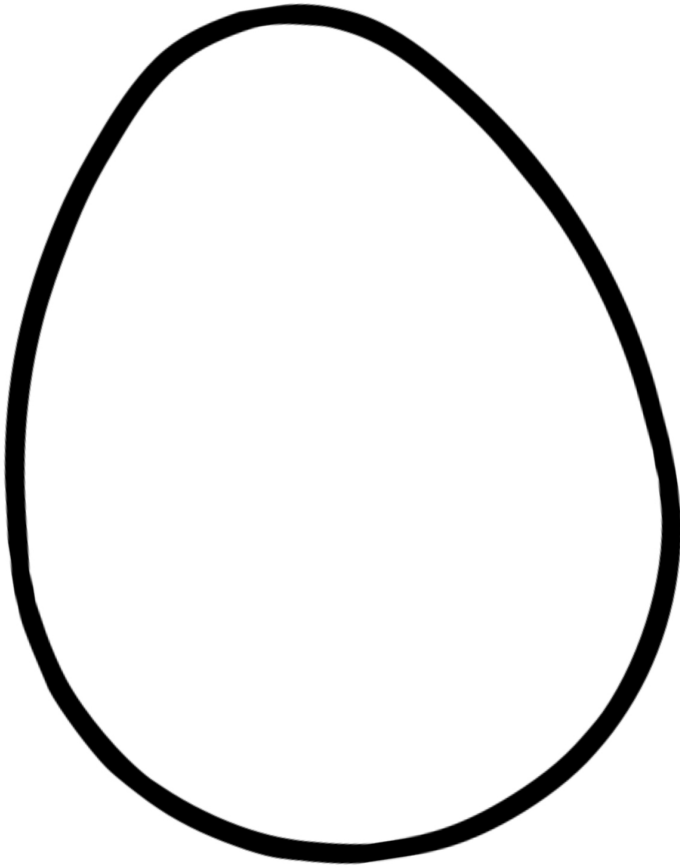

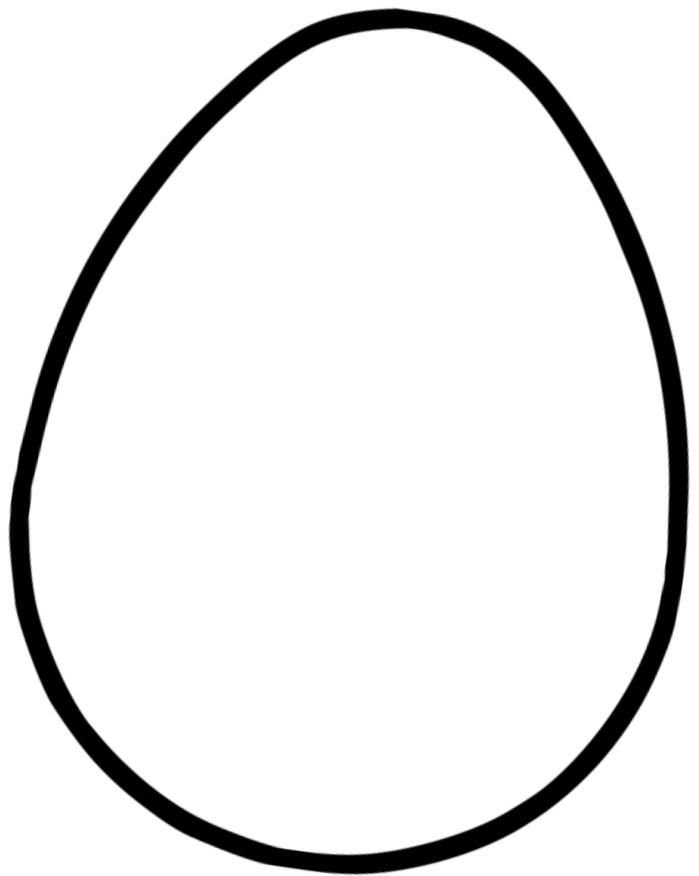
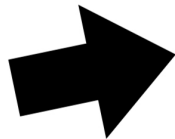
1: EGG - A - SAURUS



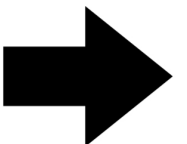
Dinosaur eggs are different to normal eggs. Imagine what your dinosaur egg looks like. Colour in this egg – does it have any strange patterns on it?

What do you imagine your dinosaur is doing there?**

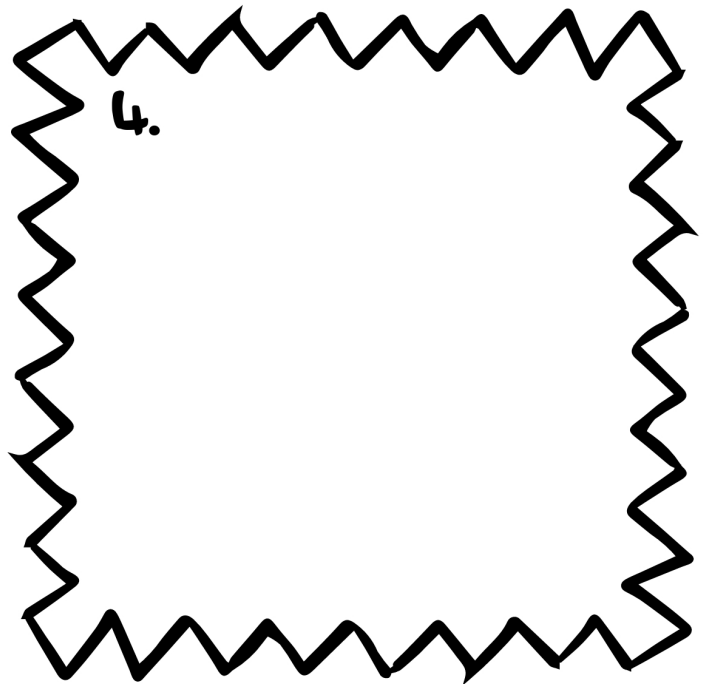
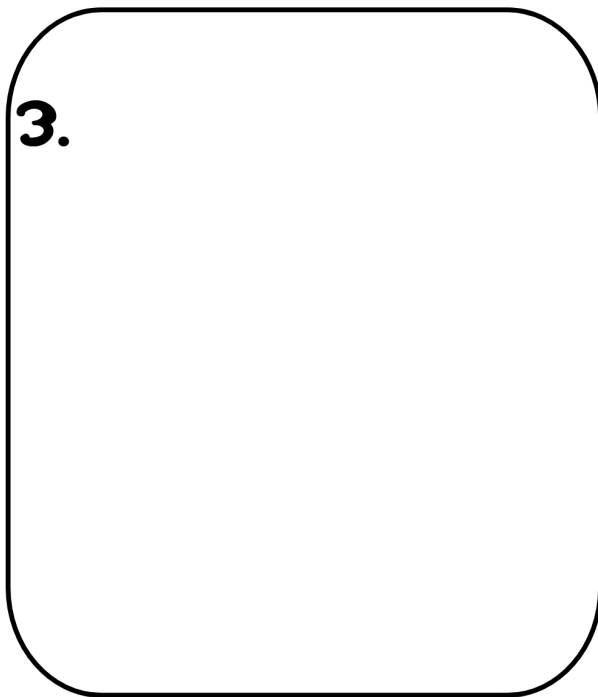
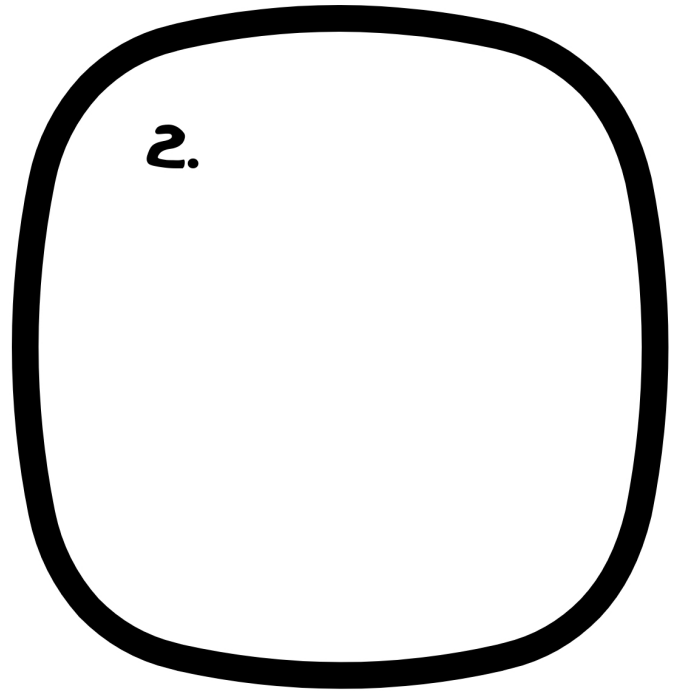
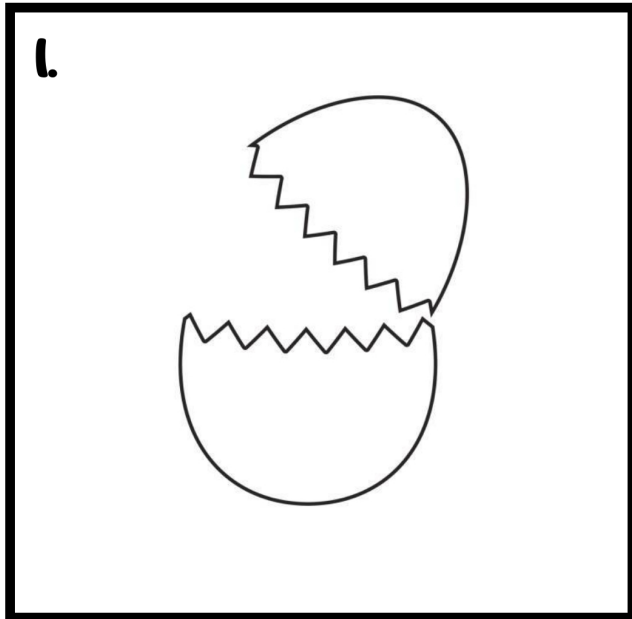

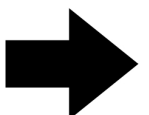
2: HELLO DINO!

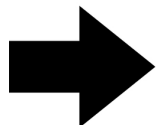
3: DINO - THOUGHTS

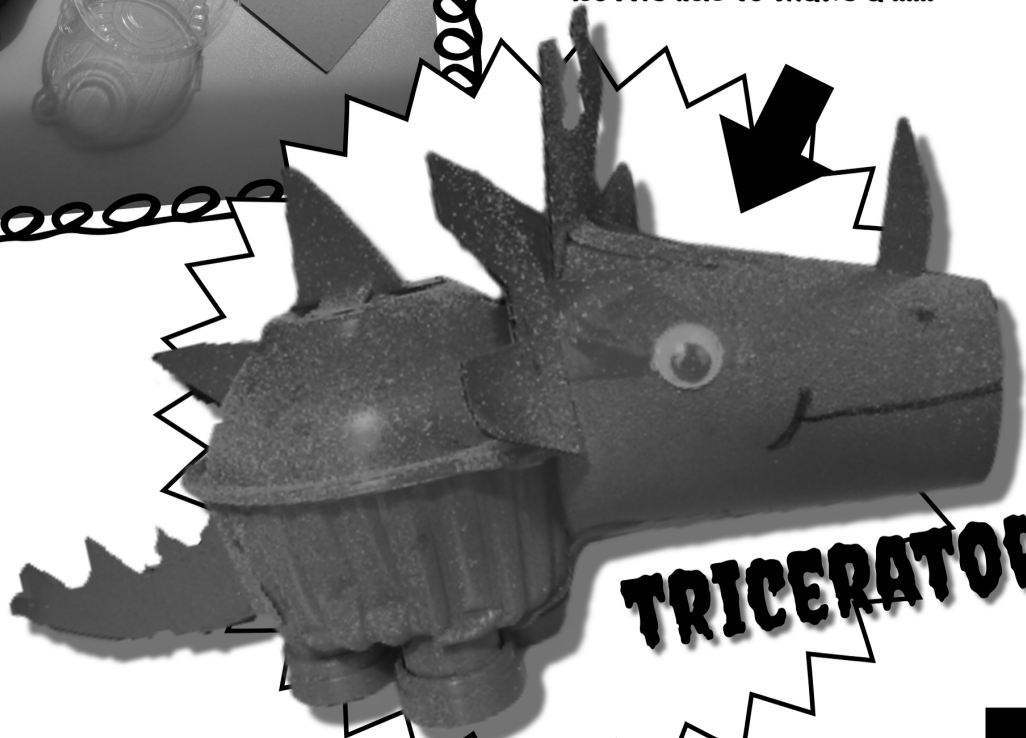
4: MAKE YOUR DINOSAUR!

Now it's time to make your dinosaur! We have made a dinosaur, but this is just an example of what you can do.

HOW WE MADE OUR DINOSAUR

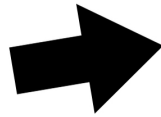
You need:



STEP 1 :

We used a cup for a head , and a muffin box for the body.

We stuck the head to the body using tape.



STEP 2:

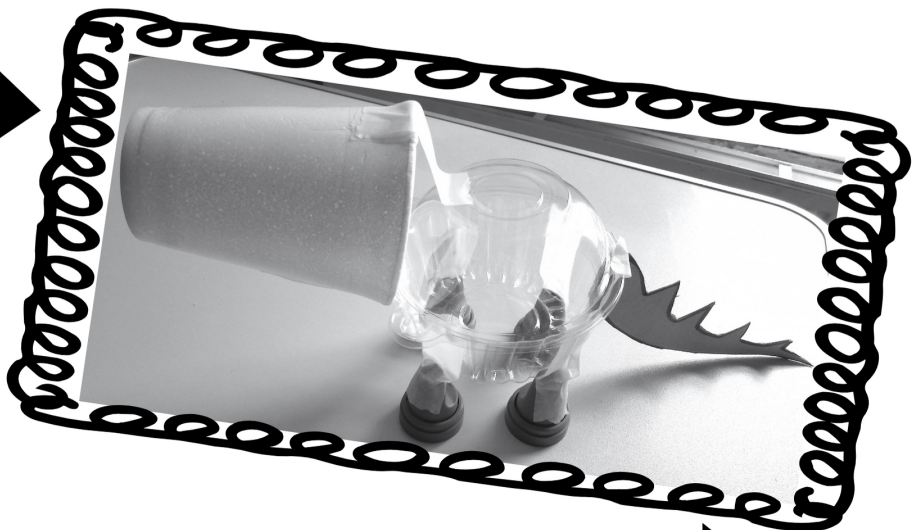
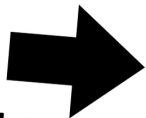
Lids from bottles can make great dino legs! We stuck them to the bottom of the body using some sticky tape.



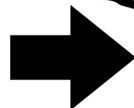
STEP 3:

Use card or paper to draw a tail for your dinosaur, then, cut it out.

Stick the tail on to the back of the body using tape.

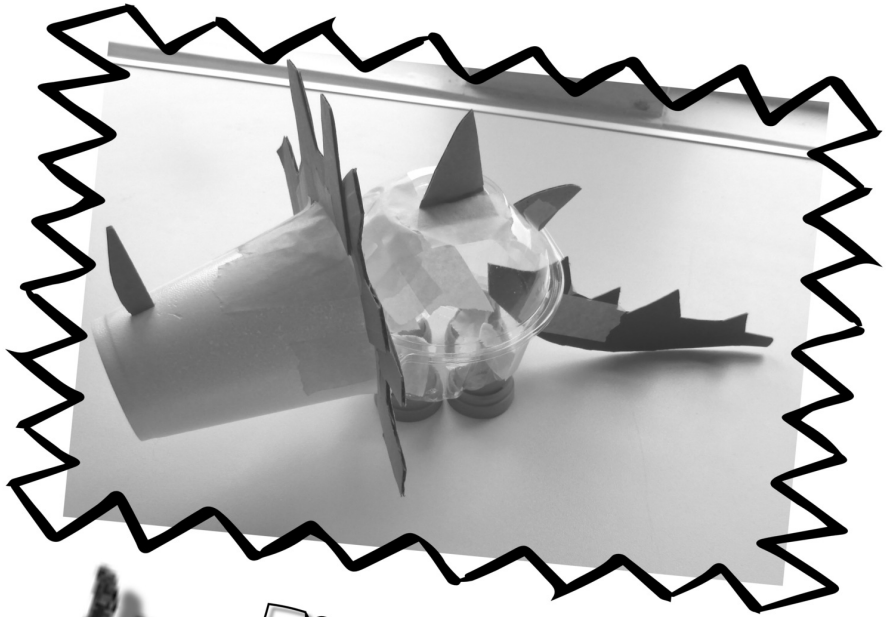


FINAL STEP



STEP 4:

The strange shape around a triceratops' head is called a 'boney frill'. It is like a shield that protects the dinosaur. We used card to make our boney frill. We also added some spikes. Then we were ready to paint!

Think about what colours you would like your dinosaur to be. Even experts are not sure what colours some dinosaurs really were.

Take care of your dinosaur. In our next activity pack, we will think about where your dinosaur lives!

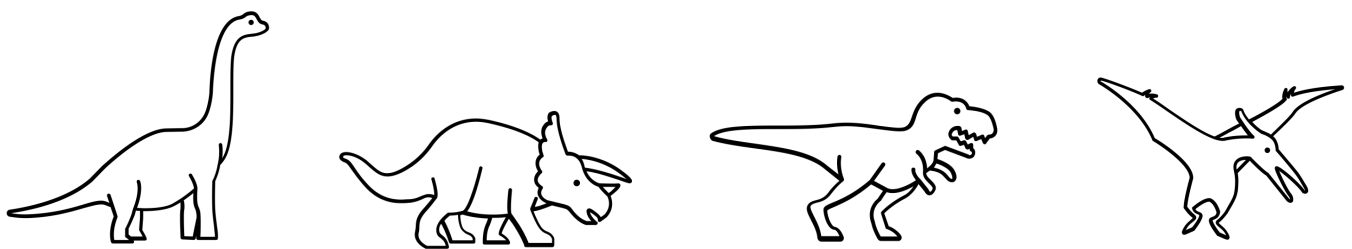
